# We Are Sibley Varsity Robotics!

The *Lightning Turtles* is an award-winning robotics team from Henry Sibley High School in Mendota Heights, MN, with 30+ diverse student members. We participate in FIRST (www.firstinspires.org), the world's leading youth-serving nonprofit advancing STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) education. Our robotics program encourages student innovation and fosters life skills -- including self-confidence, communication, and leadership. As a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization running a \$40,000+ program, we rely on sponsor donations to continue this work.

# **FIRST Robotics is a Varsity Sport!**

The FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) combines the excitement of sports with the rigors of science and technology and is an official sport of the Minnesota State High School League (MSHSL). Students can earn a varsity letter in Robotics.

We build robots year round, but over a seven week period in January & February, students design, manufacture, assemble, program, and test a robot to perform prescribed tasks against a field of competitors at two 3-day regional tournaments with over 60 teams in attendance at each.



We earned a spot at the Minnesota State Robotics Championships for each of the last 2 years.

#### **Our Diverse Team**

- Team members are not required to have any previous experience before joining
- All high school grades can participate equally
- Over 42% of our team members are women
- We are part of a tuition-free public high school where 40% of students are eligible for free or reduced-price school meals

A person who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) to report, for example, income paid to you, payments made to you in settlement of payment card and third party network transactions, real estate transactions, mortgage interest you paid, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you made

Special rules for partnerships. Partnerships that conduct a trade or business in the United States are generally required to pay a withholding tax under section 1446 on any foreign partners' share of effectively connected taxable income from such business. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, the rules under section 1446 require a partnership to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the section 1446 withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid section 1446 withholding on your share of nathership income. and avoid section 1446 withholding on your share of partnership income.
